

# Errata Sheet for Literary Map of Massachusetts

## Corrections/clarifications in alphabetical order by town/city:

**Amherst** – Address for Stannard Baker house is 118 (not 18)

**Brewster** – Conrad Aiken's House was named "Forty-One Doors"

**Concord** – The labels for Concord Museum and Orchard House (in area of detail) were reversed during the editing process.

**Deerfield** – Lucy Terry Prince House should be labeled "Lucy Terry" only. The house, called the Wells-Thorn house, is where Terry lived as an unmarried slave. When she married, and became Lucy Terry Prince, she and her husband farmed another plot of land.

**Martha's Vineyard--Chilmark:** The icon for Abel's Hill cemetery will be moved slightly to reflect its true placement on the island. Unfortunately, the cemetery has increased in significance for it has, in this past year, seen both Art Buchwald and William Styron interred there.

**Northampton** – Historic Northampton is the source of much information about Henry James and other writers in the area but please note that there is only a limited amount on display in the museum's galleries at any given time.

## Updates in alphabetical order by town/city:

**Boston – Hyde Park.** The paper mill has, unfortunately, now been closed. We are rewriting this passage to reflect its status as one of the original paper mills established on the Neponset River during colonial times and acknowledging that it operated continuously as a mill into the 21<sup>st</sup> c.

**Various Towns/Cities: Literary Tours:** We shall likely remove all tour information from the second edition of the map and put it at our web site to allow for changes/notices/etc. that we can update regularly. Meanwhile, please note:

- **Amherst** – the tour brochure is being updated. Contact the Chamber for current availability.
